



Maidenhead

JOSEPH JOHNSTON, 19, of Cookham Road, Maidenhead, was given a 12-month conditional discharge for using threatening, abusive or insulting words or behaviour likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress in Maidenhead on May 31 and failing to surrender to police or court bail on July 1. He was also ordered to pay £60 costs.

KRZYSTOP WOGUIK, 25, of Cordwallis Road, Maidenhead, was jailed for 14 days for stealing £41.99 of protein powder from Boots in Slough on June 20 while already subject to a 12-month suspended prison sentence. He was also ordered to pay £41.99 compensation and £60 costs.

LEIGH CHAMBERLAIN, 32, of The Croft, Maidenhead, was banned from driving for 24 months and given a 12-month community order with 140 hours of unpaid work for drink driving and driving without insurance in Maidenhead on June 12. He was also ordered to pay £60 costs.

KIMBERLEY CHURCHILL, 26, of Hedsor Road, Bourne End, was fined £600 for dishonestly receiving a programme included in a broadcasting service with intent to avoid paying for the reception of that programme in Bourne End on October 25 last year. She was also ordered to pay £1,095 costs.

OWEN FULTON, 35, of Trenchard Road, Holyport, was given a 12-month community order with 40 hours of unpaid work for stealing a £69.99, 600 watt inverter from Maplin Electronics in Maidenhead on May 13.

SAM MCGEORGE, 31, of Northumbria Road, Maidenhead, was given a 12-month community order for possessing heroin in Maidenhead on May 19. He was also ordered to pay £60 costs.

WENDY SPOKES, 48, of Cookham Road, Maidenhead, was given a 12-month conditional discharge for being in charge of a white Bichon Frise dog which was dangerously out of control in Maidenhead on April 22. She was also ordered to keep her dog muzzled and on a lead at all times in public places and to pay £60 costs.

SAMANTHA DAVISON, 29, of Desborough Crescent, Maidenhead, was fined £70 and ordered to pay £45 costs for using a television without a licence on February 6.

DAVID IMRIE, 43, of Greenfields, Maidenhead, was fined £220 and ordered to pay £75 costs for using a television without a licence on February 3.

MARTA SNOPKO, 31, of Courtlands, Maidenhead, was fined £110 and ordered to pay £75 costs for using a television without a licence between January 3 and February 4.

JOANNE WELLAND, 33, of Fane Way, Maidenhead, was fined £140 and ordered to pay £15 costs for using a television without a licence on February 6.

JOHN JUDGE, 55, of Peel Close, Windsor, was banned from driving for 36 months and given a four-week prison sentence suspended for 12 months for drink driving in Windsor on May 18. He was also ordered to pay £60 costs.

RYAN COWIE, 25, of Holmlea Road, Datchet, was banned from driving for 24 months and given a 12-month community order with 150 hours of unpaid work for drink driving in Datchet on June 17. He was also ordered to pay £60 costs.

FAHAD RAJA, 20, of Fairfield Avenue, Datchet, was fined £100 and ordered to pay £75 costs for possession of cannabis in Slough on June 16.
