Is your child entitled to Free School Meals?

Parents do not have to pay for school lunches if they receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) that does not exceed £16,040
- Working Tax Credit during the four-week period immediately after their employment finishes or after they start to work less than 16 hours per week

Children who receive any of the qualifying benefits listed above in their own right are also eligible to receive free school meals. At Wessex, we are also very well supported by the Spoor, Merry and Rixman Foundation, a local charity which supports children in

Maidenhead and the Ancient Parish of Bray, which includes Cox Green. They are able to help with funding for school uniform, equipment and educational trips and visits. Please ask in the office or e-mail for further details.
